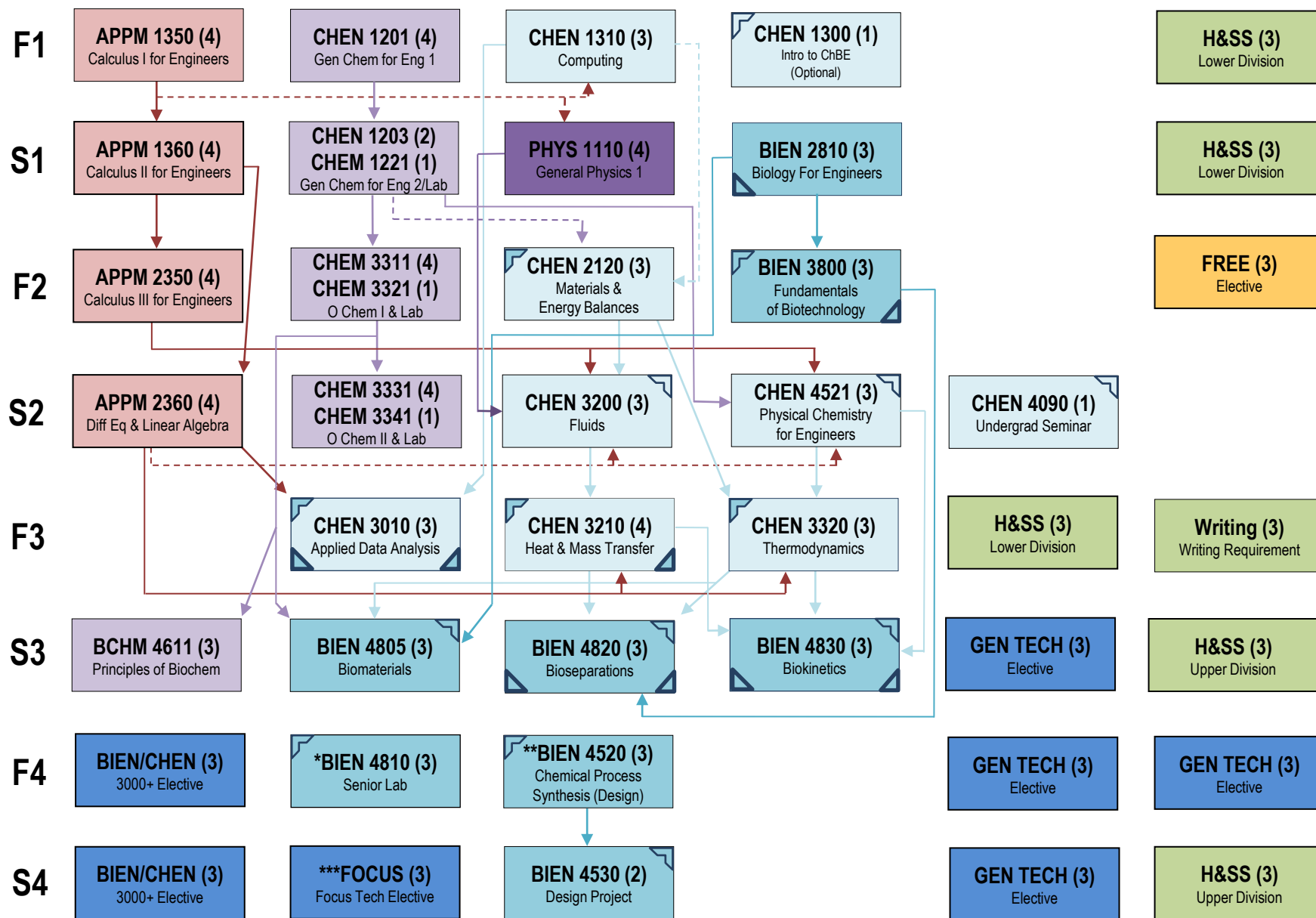


# BIOLOGICAL ENGINEERING CURRICULUM (4-Year Plan)

BIEN-BS students can take one of the below

- BIEN 4801 (3) – Pharmaceutical Biotechnology (P/C: BIEN 4830 or CHEN 4330)
- BIEN 4802 (3) – Tissue Engineering & Biomedical Devices (P: BIEN 2810 or equivalent, Department restrictions apply)
- BIEN 4803 (3) – Metabolic Engineering (P: BCHM 4611)
- BIEN 4804 (3) – Protein & Enzyme Engineering (P: BIEN 2810, BIEN 4820, and BCHM 4611)
- BIEN 4838 (3) – Immunoengineering (P: BIEN 2810 or MCDB 1150 and CHEN 4330 or BIEN 4830)
- BIEN 4838 – Special Topics courses will be added to the options intermittently

These courses are offered on a rotating basis. Please note that this means you may not always be able to take the specific course you want. If possible, we recommend completing the pre-requisites well in advance.

## **Grade Requirements**

The minimum passing grade for prerequisite and corequisite classes in our curriculum is a C-. This includes courses completed outside the department (APPM, PHYS, etc.).

In addition, students need to have a cumulative and major GPA of at least 2.0 in order to graduate from the College of Engineering.
