

WHO'S BURIED IN PHILIP'S

In northern Greece on November 8, 1977, Manolis Andronikos opened an unlooted tomb, revealing spectacular grave goods. Soon, he announced he'd found not only the tombs of ancient Macedonian royalty, but the bones of Philip II, father of Alexander the Great.
