

**Pursue a Master's or PhD at the University of Colorado Boulder:

The College of Media, Communication and Information at the University of Colorado Boulder offers an array of master's and PhD degrees in topics related to advertising and public relations, art and technology, communication, information science, journalism, and media studies. Specifically, we offer degree programs in the following areas:

The **Department of Advertising and Public Relations** offers a PhD program in strategic communication (<https://www.colorado.edu/cmci/aprd/phd>), a MA program in Strategic Communication Design (<https://www.colorado.edu/program/mscd/>), and a MA program in Corporate Communication (<https://www.colorado.edu/cmci/aprd/macc>).

All programs are currently accepting applications for the Fall 2025 cycle. Students admitted into our doctoral programs are typically appointed to graduate assistantships that include a stipend (approximately \$30,000 per academic year), a tuition waiver, and subsidized healthcare. Depending on funding availability, a limited number of part- and full-time graduate assistantships may be made available to especially well-qualified master's students.

Interested applicants are invited to attend one of our upcoming virtual information sessions on **Tuesday, October 8<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm (MDT)** and **Wednesday, October 16 at 10:00 am (MDT)**. These sessions will provide attendees with insight into our programs of study, the research opportunities available to our students, and information on living and working in beautiful Boulder Colorado.
