Eaton Humanities 160	Coping withRacism through Improvised Comedy: A Workshop with Mona Abdel-Fadil
	Welcome to a unique workshop which fuses a solution focused counselling approach with improvised comedy. The goal of the worksho is to help participants cope with racist encounters and build resilience, through targeted comic relief. The workshop will be interactive so be prepared to immerse yourself in improvised theatre.
	 What you can expect: A safe space where you can both share experiences and give one another emotional support An introduction to improvised comedy as a coping method and a means of diffusing tension (comic relief) Practice your ability to both listen to and understand multiple perspectives Loads of laughter and silliness The workshop will be tailored to the size of the group and the participants' own experiences with racism.
	Mona Abdel-Fadil is a British-born Egyptian-Norwegian diversity trainer, counsellor, researcher, improviser, teacher, satirist, and comedy performer. Mona is currently developing applied impro workshops and tools that help participants cope with racism, trauma, and exclusion through humour and improvised comedy. She is a Senior Researcher at <i>The Norwegian Centre for Holocaust and Minority Studies</i> . She is also on of the curators of the contemporary and research-based exhibition, In/Visible: Everyday Racism in Norway.
