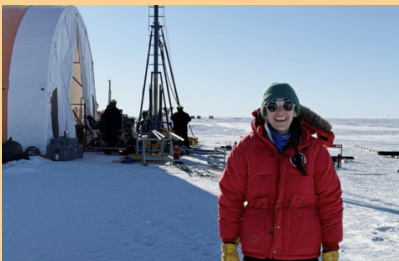

### Earth Sciences Colloquium: Dr. Ryan Venturelli

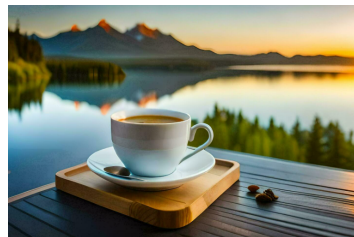
**Topic:** Holocene Retreat and Re-Advance: Untangling Past [In]Stabilities of the West Antarctic Ice Sheet

### Front Range Industry & Postdoc Summit & Core Facility Open House



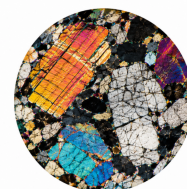

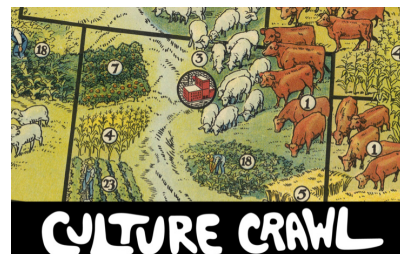
