Kara Reynolds has been a faculty member in the Department of Economics at American University for more than 20 years. Her research examines the intersection of politics and international trade policy, with particular attention to antidumping protection, the World Trade Organization's dispute settlement system, trade wars, the distributional consequences of trade protection, and the relationship between trade policy and innovation. Her current work focuses on how export controls affect trade flows and technological development.

Reynolds teaches courses in International Trade, Microeconomic Theory, and Economics, as well as specialized one-credit seminars such as Swiftonomics: The Economics of Taylor Swift and The Economics of Immigration.
