*Description*: This course introduces basic concepts and techniques of neo-classical microeconomic analysis. We will cover traditional theories such as consumer and producer theories; and in the process also discuss some research applications to facilitate the transition to independent research.

*Grades*: There will be a midterm and a final exam. Midterm counts **0.35** and the final **0.45** of your grade. There will be occasional homework assignments that together with class participation will count **0.20** of your grade.
