The PhD in Economics

The W. P. Carey PhD in Economics equips students for research and teaching positions at top institutions of higher education in the world, as well as research positions in public agencies or private organizations. The program is relatively small, with about 40 full-time doctoral students in residence at any time. A low student-to-faculty ratio allows us to provide greater faculty attention and mentoring than larger programs.

The Economics Department at ASU is known for the strength in Macroeconomics. Additionally, over the last several years, the department has recruited a strong research group in empirical microeconomics, along with environmental economics, economic theory, financial economics, and econometrics.

Our recent graduates have published in the American Economic Review, Econometrica, and other leading journals. Stipends are competitive with top graduate programs. We are eager to build on the successes of our alumni.


Dear Economics Colleagues:
