My research examines how gender and sexuality and K-12 schooling systems interact. I apply principles from queer theory, intersectional feminist theory, and critical transgender studies to understand and improve policies and practices at the classroom, school, district, state, and federal levels. My recent work has explored the changing role of Title IX in K-12 schools, experiences of teachers supporting student activism for LGBTQ+ equity, and the roles of student clubs (such as Gender and Sexuality Alliances) in improving school systems.
