All positions require professionalism, strong communication skills, attention to detail, and the ability to work independently in a structured digital environment.

The required and preferred qualifications below apply to all roles. Please refer to the position descriptions that follow for role-specific responsibilities.

Required Skills

- Subject matter expertise in assigned courses
- Strong time management and organization skills and the ability to work independently
- Strong English written and verbal skills, especially over email
- An enthusiasm for learning new systems, both technical and non-technical
- Ability to solve problems independently and creatively
- Sensitivity to and appreciation of cultural, political and geographical differences with ability to work well with faculty, staff and students from around the world

Preferred Skills

- Familiarity with the Coursera platform
- A background in teaching and learning, online education and/or engineering
- Familiarity with software that may include web-based website creation/maintenance, video/image editing and cloud-based documents/spreadsheets
- Basic knowledge of scripting languages (i.e. Python, Perl, PHP, Javascript) and/or markup languages (i.e. XML)
- Successful completion of one or more of the related EMP courses

ME-EM Course Facilitator

10 hours per week | Begins at \$27/hour

We seek 8–10 Course Facilitators for the 2026–2027 academic year.

Core Responsibilities

- Host weekly Zoom office hours to support students
- Respond to student inquiries submitted via Salesforce
- Review flagged course items, plagiarism flags, and other course maintenance tasks
- Edit and update course content on Coursera with instructor's consent and approval
- Collaborate with faculty to address academic or technical issues outside facilitator scope
- Escalate student concerns appropriately to supervisors and stakeholders
- Review gradebooks and complete grade overrides at the end of each session

Cohort Commitment

- Mandatory onboarding session in April (prior to Summer 1 session in May)
- Commitment through Spring 2027
- Attendance at bi-weekly team meetings
- Participation in training at the start of Fall and Spring semesters
- Potential for additional hours based on program needs
- Flexible work schedule outside required meetings

Cohort Intern

10 hours per week | Begins at \$28/hour

We seek one Cohort Intern to provide leadership and operational coordination for the Course Facilitator team.

Core Responsibilities

- Assist in supervision, development, and evaluation of Course Facilitator Cohort
- Lead onboarding and training for Course Facilitators
- Monitor Salesforce to ensure tickets are managed and resolved
- Send announcements, reminders, and operational updates
- Track task completion and follow up as needed
- Assist Course Facilitators with Coursera platform troubleshooting

- Monitor and review course feedback monthly, and suggest opportunities for improvement
