- Applicants may submit the same original work for multiple English Department awards.

	Applicants must have taken/be enrolled in at least one Creative Writing poetry workshop (ENGL 2021, 3021, and/or 4021) to demonstrate an interest in writing poetry.

Award winners must be enrolled as full-time students and must remain in good academic standing for the duration of the award (fall and spring of the following academic year). Applicants must have a graduation date no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application). Preference will be given to residents of Colorado, and past Tobin scholars who maintain a 2.80 or better GPA and
competitively reapply for continuation of the scholarship. mission Requirements: Submit a creative writing short story (5 – 10 pages, typed, double-spaced) titled and formatted, as it would appear in publication.
