- ❖ Eligible undergraduate students are encouraged to apply for English Department Scholarships & Awards during our annual application cycle each spring.
- ❖ *Applicants should apply to all English scholarships for which they qualify. Please review the qualification checklists below for specific eligibility requirements.*
- ❖ *Applicants may submit the same original work for multiple English Department awards.*

- ❖ These awards, like any student prize or scholarship given through the university, will be credited to the selected winners via their account at the Bursar's Office to be applied to their student tuition for the upcoming academic year.

Eligibility Qualifications & Submission Requirements



The Alex McGuiggan Scholarship

Amount *up to* \$1500 (1 award)

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled on the Boulder campus as full-time students. Good academic standing is required.
- Applicants must be planning to graduate no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- Applicants must have a declared major in the English Department and have already been admitted to the Creative Writing track.
- Applicants must have taken/be enrolled in at least one Creative Writing poetry workshop (ENGL 2021, 3021, and/or 4021) to demonstrate an interest in writing poetry.

Submission Requirements:

- Submit between five and ten pages of poems titled and formatted, as they would appear in publication.
- The first page of your poetry submission should be an index of all poems contained in your submission.
- All poems must be strung together into one document.
- Insert a header with the name of the award in the upper right corner of each page.
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- No extraneous marks, grades, names or other identifying information should be included on the pages of poetry.
- Save your submission as a PDF titled: YourLastName_McGuiggan



The Curtis Michael Gimeno Memorial Scholarship

Amount *up to* \$3200 (1 award)

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled on the Boulder campus as full-time students. Good academic standing is required.
- Applicants must currently be either a sophomore or a junior, graduating no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- Applicants must have a declared major in the English Department and have already been admitted to the Creative Writing track.
- Applicants must have taken/be enrolled in at least one Creative Writing poetry workshop (ENGL 2021, 3021, and/or 4021) to demonstrate an interest in writing poetry.

Submission Requirements:

Creative submission:

- One (only) of the following: three poems, one short story, a piece of creative non-fiction, or a segment of a stage or screenplay.
- All creative works must be titled and formatted, as they would appear in publication. No extraneous marks, grades, names or other identifying information should be included.
- Insert a header with the name of the award in the upper right corner of each page.
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save your creative submission as a PDF titled: YourLastName_Gimeno

Personal statement:

- Up to two pages (typed, double-spaced) outlining your creative aspirations.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g. J. Doe, Gimeno Memorial Scholarship).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save as a PDF titled: YourLastName_GimenoStatement



The Dick Shahan CU-Boulder Undergraduate Writing Competition

Amount *up to* \$1900 (2 awards)

Qualifications:

- The competition is open to undergraduate students currently enrolled in an English course at the CU-Boulder campus (status can be part-time or full-time).
- Applicants must be graduating no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- You may submit a piece you wrote in the past, so long as it follows the submission requirements detailed below.

Submission Requirements:

- Submit between 12 and 20 pages (typed, double-spaced) of prose.
- Applicants may choose from these genres of writing: realistic or experimental fiction, fantasy, satire, regular or creative non-fiction, or critical essay or article (with a research-and-appropriate-notes component). Entries will be in prose form only; no poetry, screenplays, scripts, or multimedia works are eligible. All subject matter should be in good taste.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g., J. Doe, Shahan CW Competition).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save document as PDF titled: YourLastName_ShahanUG



The Gentian Ascension Scholarship

Amount *up to* \$1500 (2 awards)

Qualifications:

- Applicants should demonstrate budding talent as a writer.
- Applicants must be currently enrolled on the Boulder campus. Good academic standing is required.
- Applicants must have a declared major in the English Department, either Literature or Creative Writing track.
- Applicants must currently be either a junior or senior, graduating no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- Applicants must be able to demonstrate having overcome academic obstacles (ideally through grades).

Submission Requirements:

1. Personal narrative:

- Up to two pages (typed, double-spaced) outlining your qualifications for this scholarship.
- This narrative should include a comparison of grades that demonstrates having overcome an academic obstacle.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g., J. Doe, Gentian Ascension).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 2) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save document as PDF titled: YourLastName_GentianNarrative

2. Writing sample:

- Up to five pages (typed, double-spaced) that demonstrates talent as a writer.
- The writing sample should be a clean copy with no extraneous comments, marks, or grades on it. The genre is not restricted; it can include literary criticism, poetry, fiction, drama etc.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g., J. Doe, Gentian Ascension).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save document as PDF titled YourLastName_GentianWritingSample

3. Current Degree Audit:

- Submit a current and complete Degree Audit.
- Title “Degree Audit for Gentian Ascension Award.”
- Save document as PDF titled YourLastName_GentianDegreeAudit

Levitt Undergraduate Writing Award

Amount *up to* \$1500 (1 awards)

The donors of the Paul Levitt Undergraduate Writing Award wish to reward gracefully written arguments and analyses produced by undergraduate students currently enrolled at the University of Colorado Boulder. Eligible students are invited to submit an essay following the prompt detailed below. The most compelling essays will be selected to receive the award.

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be first- or second-year students currently enrolled on the Boulder campus in good academic standing.
- Award winners must remain enrolled as undergraduate students on the CU Boulder campus in good academic standing for the duration of the award.

Submission Requirements:

- One 3 - 5-page essay, double spaced.
- Follow the instructions detailed under essay prompt below.
- The essay should be a clean copy with no extraneous comments, marks, or grades on it.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g., J. Doe, Levitt UG Writing).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save your essay submission as a PDF titled: YourLastName_Levitt UG Writing

The Harold D. Kelling Essay Prize

Amount *up to* \$1000 (1 award)

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled on the Boulder campus as full-time students. Good academic standing is required.
- Applicants must currently be either a junior or senior, graduating no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).

Submission Requirements:

- An essay (short stories, etc., are not eligible) written for a University of Colorado Boulder English Department class.
- The essay may have been written at any time during the applicant's career at the university.
- No extraneous marks or grades should be included on your essay.
- Insert a header that includes the name of the award, your first initial and last name in the upper right corner of each page (e.g., J. Doe, Kelling Essay Prize).
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save your essay as a PDF titled: YourLastName_Kelling



The Robert Manford Tobin, Jr. Scholarship

Amount *up to* \$1600 (1 award)

Qualifications:

- Entering freshmen and continuing students are eligible to apply.
- Applicants must have a declared major in Arts and Sciences on the Boulder campus.
- Award winners must be enrolled as full-time students and must remain in good academic standing for the duration of the award (fall and spring of the following academic year).
- Applicants must have a graduation date no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- Preference will be given to residents of Colorado, and past Tobin scholars who maintain a 2.80 or better GPA and competitively reapply for continuation of the scholarship.

Submission Requirements:

- Submit a short story (5 – 10 pages, typed, double-spaced) titled and formatted, as it would appear in publication.
- No extraneous marks, grades, names or other identifying information should be included on the pages of your submission.
- Insert a header with the name of the award in the upper right corner of each page.
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save your essay as a PDF titled: YourLastName_Tobin



Jovanovich Imaginative Writing Award Competition

Amount *up to* \$1400 (2 awards)

Qualifications:

- Applicants must be currently enrolled on the Boulder campus as full-time students. Good academic standing is required.
- Applicants must currently be either a junior or a senior, graduating no earlier than the spring of the next academic year (one year after the award cycle in which they submitted an application).
- Applicants must either have a declared major in the English Department (Literature or Creative Writing track) or have taken/be enrolled in a creative writing course in the current academic year.

Submission Requirements:

- One (only) of the following: three poems, one short story, a piece of creative non-fiction, or a segment of a stage or screenplay.
- All creative works must be titled and formatted as they would appear in publication.
- No extraneous marks, grades, names or other identifying information should be included.
- Insert a header with the name of the award in the upper right corner of each page.
- Insert page numbers (e.g., page 1 of 5) in the lower right corner of each page.
- Save your submission as a PDF titled: YourLastName_Jovanovich



Martin Luther King, Jr. English Literature Scholarship

Amount *up to* \$5000 (2 awards)

The donors of the Martin Luther King, Jr. English Literature Scholarship wish to provide undergraduate scholarship awards for students pursuing an English Literature degree in the Department of English within the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Colorado Boulder.

Personal Statement:

- Please submit a 500-word personal statement describing how the MLK Jr. Scholarship will make a difference to you. How will it change your trajectory going forward? How might it be a life-changing gift?

Submission Requirements:

- Please submit the assignment that you have completed for an English class that you are most proud of.
- Your submission could be a paper, a creative work, or a project, including a web page, audio, or video.
- There is no minimum or maximum length. If you choose to submit an audio or video sample, please indicate a link that will take readers to your sample in the document you upload in the application or send an audio or video file to ssengl@colorado.edu.
Please include “MLK, Jr. Scholarship” in the subject field.
- If you send your sample to that email address, you can upload a document in the application indicating that you did so.

Awards Offers by Invitation or Nomination Only

The Joanne Easley Arnold Award *(invitation only)*

Amount up to \$3000 (2 awards)

Top performing students in the English Department's gateway courses (ENGL 2102 and ENGL 2112) will be invited by to apply for this prestigious award. These students will be identified at the end of their sophomore year by grade point average by the department and invited to submit an essay.

Applicants may only apply for this award when invited by the English Department. Special application instructions will be included with the invitation.

Eugene F. Irey Memorial Scholarship Fund *(nomination only)*

Amount up to \$1500 (1 award)

This award was established by the English Department in 2017 with a generous estate donation from Charlotte York Irey. This award was created to provide an undergraduate scholarship award to a student enrolled in a 3000 and/or 4000-level course in American Literature.

All English faculty who taught or are teaching one or more 3000 or 4000-level courses that fulfill the American Literature degree requirement in the previous fall or current spring semester are invited to nominate one or more exceptional students for this award. Eligible courses must end in a "-5".

To be eligible for nomination, students must currently be enrolled in the College of Arts and Sciences as an undergraduate student and must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher. Students must have a graduation date no earlier than the fall of the next academic year (one semester after the award cycle in which they are nominated for the award).
