Brief description of Your Organization:

Whether you're juggling big life decisions, powering through zoom calls, exploring the mountains, or going out to dinner, your Oliver Charles sweater will always be there for you. The sweater is the most versatile item in your closet, that lets you quickly and elegantly shift between work and life, which is increasingly important as we blur the lines between the two.

Every Oliver Charles sweater is made in Brooklyn, NY, on advanced 3D-knitting machines that "print" each sweater in a single piece without seams, making them lighter and stronger while reducing waste. The sweaters are made from khullu ("coo-loo"), a super fiber from high elevation Tibetan yak, and merino wool. Both materials are world-renowned for temperature regulation and odor resistance, ideal for repeat wear and simplifying the most hectic weeks. It's not just a sweater, it's a single item for all of life.

Describe the nature/goals of the project(s):

Oliver Charles' Sustainability Content Marketing Internship focuses on conducting in-depth research on a theme of your choice based around sustainable fashion (AKA slow-fashion).

The research will end in a 6-part blog series, which we will publish on our blog, #Repeat. You will complete one blog per week, and at the end of the internship, you will write a reflection of your experience.

As part of the blog series, you will also have the opportunity to take Oliver Charles' 1-Week Challenge. As part of the 1-Week Challenge, you will receive an Oliver Charles sweater to wear for a week straight. At the end of the week, you'll write about your experience testing out what it's like to repeat styles and get more out of a key item for the personal uniform.
