

David C. LaFevor is Assistant Professor of Latin American History and Digital Humanities at the University of Texas at Arlington. His previous books examine the histories of U.S.-Latin relations, American boxing and masculinity in and Mexico, Cuba capitalism, slavery, and the law at the end of the Atlantic

slave trade. He is also the director of the digital humanities project "Siete Villas de Cuba," which locates, digitizes, and publishes endangered archives pertinent to the slave trade in Cuba.
