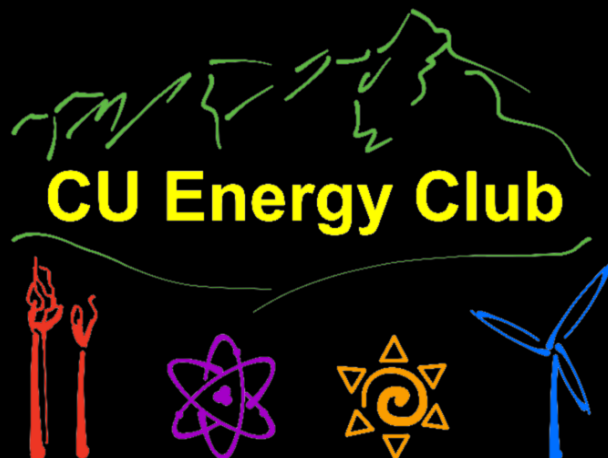
Join us and Uli Kappas from ProvidIce for a discussion on climate change, water crisis, and how they are solving problem. Food will be provided!
