Colorado Water Stories: Learning from our Past, Reimagining our Future

Topics

The symposium aims to highlight new and innovative methods to help Colorado achieve its water goals. As Colorado's population continues to grow, novel water management techniques will be needed to sustain the Colorado lifestyle. Some of the signature tools at our disposal revolve around aquifer storage and recovery (ASR), geophysical monitoring, resiliency planning, and reimagining rivers. Different and innovative ideas and applications regarding the management of surface and groundwater are encouraged to apply for the symposium's poster session.

Abstracts

An abstract is required to confirm your interest and that your topic aligns with that of the conference. Please compose a paragraph of no more than 350 words, describing your poster topic, and send to sgoldstein@wrightwater.com by March 22, 2019. You will be notified if your poster abstract has been accepted or rejected.

Formatting Rules

Maximum dimensions (inches): 34 width x 44 length (ANSI E). Paper, bond, or film. If mounted, please use only a foam core substrate; other materials may be too heavy.

Suggestions for poster style:

- **Title** should be in bold. Author's affiliations and e-mail addresses should be included.
- **Text:** a poster should be easily readable from a distance of 1 – 2 meters, and 1.5 or 2 lines of spaces should be used between each line. It is advised that authors should also pay attention to the following points:
 - **Headings** should be 25% larger than normal text. Bold or other colors may be used.
 - **Suggested font sizes** are (for the A0 format):
 - Main title: 78 pt (bold, upper case)
 - Author: 72 pt (bold, title case)
 - Affiliation(s): 48 pt (normal, title case)
 - Email address: 36 pt (bold)
 - Subheading: 36 pt (bold upper case)
 - Body of text: 24 pt (normal)
 - Smaller fonts may be used in citations and acknowledgement.
- **The amount of text** should be kept to a minimum, and each block of text should include no more than a few sentences.
- **Visual impact** is important and you are encouraged to include color images and background.

Location and Poster Session

After abstract acceptance, submit a pdf version of your poster by March 15, 2019. Individuals with accepted posters must also register for the symposium if they wish to attend the full day at a discounted rate. Registration is not required for the attendance at the poster session only.
