

Activity Overview

Character Map:

In the Character Map activity, students will pick two main characters from "One Crazy Summer" that they will compare with 3-4 classmates. They will fill out the Character Map (one for each character) together to come up with different ideas and collaborate as a group about the differing points of view. This is beneficial for students to practice writing and communicating ideas to peers when comparing ideas and perspectives. For example, comparing Cecile and Delphine and their separate perspectives that evolve throughout the book. While comparing the different themes the characters face - including their goals, settings, problems, and more - they can also be creative using colors to color and draw little doodles, eventually sharing with other classmates.



- Instruct kids to make groups of 4 (5 at the most), and provide the character map comparison handout to each group.
- Provide a list on the board of each character pair that is available to do for the character map, and instruct one child from each group to "sign their group up" under one of the pairs. These are the characters they will research!
- Instruct the kids to work as a group to fill out the sheet for the characters they signed up for, and to look through the book to see how each of them think, feel, and act...and to create similarities between them.
- Wrap up by having kids share their worksheets with the class!



- Students can compare the similarities and differences between each character in the book.
- If a group finishes early, they can compare the similarities and differences of the character and their own lives in their small groups.
- Assess if students used ideas and evidence from the book in their character map.
- If students prefer speaking/writing in a different language, allow and provide them that option
- Allow students who need a alternative way to complete the assignment to draw or color the characters to show these characteristics
- An easy add on is doing a gallery walk after all the groups complete their character maps.
