


**Grade Level: 1st** 


**Standard:** Physical Science

Grade Level Expectation: Sound can vibrate and vibrating matter can make sound.

Evidence Outcome: Plan and conduct investigations to provide evidence that vibrating materials can make a sound and that sound can make materials vibrate. (1-PS4-1) (Clarification Statement: Examples of vibrating materials that make sound could include tuning forks and plucking a stretched string)

## Activity



#### **Rubber Band Guitar Vibration Activity**

In this hands-on activity, first graders will explore how sound is created by vibrations. After listening to a read-aloud of *Adela's Mariachi Band*, students will build a simple rubber band guitar using a tissue box and rubber bands. Through this activity, they will be able to hear, feel, and see that sound is produced by vibrations. Students will experiment with the tightness and thickness of the rubber bands to observe how these factors change the pitch, and they will test how plucking the strings harder affects the volume. Finally, they will explain how Adela's instruments make sound using key vocabulary such as *vibration* and *pitch*.

# What is a Mariachi Band?

Video Example:




Things to think about while watching the video:

- What kinds of instruments are they playing?
- Did you connect any of their instruments in the video to the instruments in the book?
- How did the mariachi players play the guitar?

### Materials:

- Rubber bands (6)
- Empty tissue box and empty paper towel roll \*\*Class set needed
- Crayons (to decorate)
- Tape or glue
- Scissors

## Steps Part 1:

#### • Connect to the story


- After reading the story, discuss how Adela's guitar makes sound when the strings move. Explain that the movement of sound is called a vibration.
  - You can show how clapping moves air which is also considered a vibration.

#### • Prepare the Guitar Box

- Give each student an empty tissue box, making sure that the hole at the top is open (This will act as the hole in a guitar).
- You can let your students color and decorate their boxes with crayons.

#### • Add the strings

Stretch about 5 rubber bands of different widths around the box, making sure to put them over the hole in the box.



## Steps Part 2:

#### Test the vibrations

- Have your students pluck each band one at a time (explain that they should see the band vibrating or "shaking").
- Ask questions like, "What do you notice about the bands?" or "What can you feel when you pluck the band?"
- Connect what they have created back to real instruments and how they vibrate
  - Ask questions like "How is our box guitar like Adela's guitar?"
     emphasizing that musical instruments make sound because their parts
     vibrate.

## Additional Suggestions



### Extending the activity further or for a higher grade level:

- When choosing rubber bands, have some thicker ones and some thinner ones to vary the sound of the strings.
- Attach the rubber bands (guitar strings) to small bolts that can turn, so the strings are able to tighten or loosen, which will adjust the sound of your guitar.
