

What is the Program in Exploratory Studies (PES)?

Program in Exploratory Studies

- Currently home to over 2,500 students
- Space to explore who you are, what you want, and how to get there
- Guidance and resources to help you discover and shape your academic journey as you transition into your best fit major
- Non-degree granting program
 - PES students transfer into one of six different colleges/schools, typically after first year



Transferring into colleges/school at CU Boulder

- Intra-University Transfer (IUT)
- Every college/school sets their own requirements
- Most require:
 - Successful completion of certain courses
 - Meet minimum grade, GPA and credit hours
- Usually takes at least two semesters to complete IUT requirements

Advising Support



- Team Based Advising: Book an individual appointment with any advisor on the Exploratory Studies Team
- Drop-in Advising: Monday-Friday 1:00-3:00 PM with additional hours around registration windows
- Weekly Emails: Updates on important dates, deadlines and events across campus

First-Year Academic Experience

- FYXP 1500: First Year Success Seminar
 - 16-week, online, asynchronous course focusing on helping connect you with different campus resources and develop essential tools for college success.
 - Weekly topics and assignments will focus on topics such as wellness, career exploration and navigating the classroom and campus.

- Physics help room: Drop-in tutoring for CU Physics courses




Important Upcoming Dates
