Student Certification

Important: In some cases, your financial aid may not be allowed to pay a balance from a previous semester. I understand that I may have to make a payment to the university for the past due balance with my financial aid refund.

I understand and acknowledge that if my eligibility for the financial aid listed above changes, I am responsible for all charges on my student bill. In the event that it becomes necessary to enforce payment of delinquent charges due the University, and my account is referred to an outside collection agency, by action of law or otherwise, the delinquency may be reported to national credit bureaus and I may be responsible for collection costs and reasonable attorneys' fees allowed by the laws of the state of Colorado. Pursuant to C.R.S. § 23-5-115, in the event of a default of my account owed to the university, the university may certify to the Colorado Department of Revenue (DOR) information about me, including my name, social security number, the amount of the debt and any other identifying information required by the DOR. The Colorado Department of Revenue may then disburse funds to the university in satisfaction of that debt from tax refund amounts owed to me, if any.
