## \_\_\_\_\_\* Safety Do's, Don'ts and Emergency Contacts \*\_\_\_\_\_

## Do's

- 1. Always use common sense and good professional judgment.
- 2. When in doubt, seek help and advice.
- 3. Apply for a Hot Work Permit when planning hot work such as welding, soldering, or grinding.
- 4. Ensure that any chemicals which are used or stored together are compatible.
- 5. Dispose all oily rags in UL listed metal containers for oily rags.
- 6. Keep chemical containers closed when not in use.
- 7. Keep all chemicals in their original labeled containers.
- 8. Read the MSDS of the material you plan to use.
- 9. Follow all manufacturers' recommendations and requirements.
- 10. Use only electrical devices and equipment that are UL listed.
- 11. Implement good housekeeping, accidents are more likely in areas with poor housekeeping.
- 12. Eliminate all potential tripping hazards in the work area.
- 13. Have established procedures for the closing of shop operations during emergencies and power outage.
- 14. If a device emits an unusual odor, turn it off and unplug it immediately. Do not use the device until it is repaired.
- 15. Wear safety glasses.
- 16. Ensure that spills are cleaned immediately and safely.

## Don'ts

- 1. Don't leave running machinery unattended.
- 2. Don't leave running heat producing devices unattended.
- 3. Don't work alone, particularly when doing work that can potentially create hazards.
- 4. Don't use flammable or combustible materials in unventilated areas or near potential ignition sources.
- 5. Don't conduct sensitive or potentially dangerous work when you are not focused, e.g., due to lack of sleep or similar issues.
- 6. Don't use electrical devices with frayed or damaged cords or exposed wiring.
- 7. Don't use makeshift equipment unless approved by the shop supervisor.
- 8. Don't continue using a device if it consistently trips the circuit breaker.
- 9. Don't use corridors, exits and other means of egress for any storage or work.
- 10. Don't block fire doors in an open position.
- 11. Don't attach any items to sprinkler piping and keep activities away from sprinkler heads. Sprinklers can discharge large amounts of water in a short period.
