GHSC Operational Landslide Geologist position

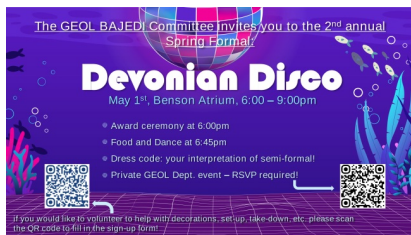
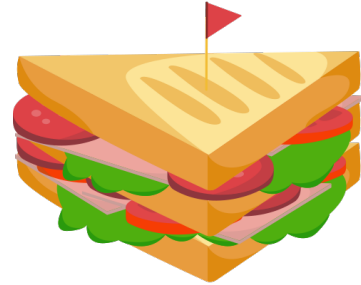
