

#### **NSF INTERN funding**

The National Science Foundation (NSF) is offering supplemental funding under its Non-Academic Research Internships for Graduate Students (INTERN) program, enabling graduate students on active NSF awards to pursue six-month, non-academic research internships—providing up to \$55,000 for travel, tuition, health insurance, stipend, and other related costs.




#### **Graduate Student Achievement**
