Scholarships and Stipends

NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (NSF GRFP)

The NSF GRFP provides three years of support (\$37K/year plus tuition and fees) for students pursuing research in STEM fields. The deadline for Geoscience applicants is **October 30, 2025, at 5:00 PM local time**. Eligible students include senior undergraduates, those in a gap year, and 1st- or 2nd-year graduate students. Chancellor's Postdoctoral Fellowship

CU Boulder invites applications for the Chancellor's Postdoctoral Fellowship, a one-year award designed to support promising researchers and educators in preparing for tenure-track faculty careers. Applicants must have earned a doctorate/terminal degree by July 1, 2026, within the last three years (2023 or later), and be preparing for an academic career. First deadline is **Nov. 3rd, 2025!**


