


Colloquium and Happenings

GEOL Electives and Field Classes

GEOL 5700-836: Machine Learning in the Hydrological Science

Machine learning (ML) is changing the hydrologic sciences at a very rapid pace. Applications of ML extend from streamflow forecasting to modeling groundwater flow to predicting lake levels. ML tools provide efficient and easy-to-use alternatives to complex and computationally expensive physical models. And the results generated are often better, according to many standard validation metrics. But what are the potential downsides and pitfalls to using ML? Should we always trust the results provided by these black-box approaches?

Scholarships and Stipends

Dissertation Completion FE + Carol B. Lynch Memorial FE

This fellowship is intended to provide outstanding PhD candidates with financial support to assist in the process of completing their doctoral dissertations. The fellowship consists of full support for one academic semester (either fall 2025 or spring 2026) and includes a monthly stipend equal to that of the current 50% GPTI salary, tuition coverage of up to five dissertation hours, mandatory fees, and coverage under the student gold health insurance plan. Students will need to advance to D status by the end of the Spring 2025 semester or will be ineligible to receive the fellowship. Deadline Nov. 8, 2024.




