\*Grad School Dissertation Completion FE\* - Due Tomorrow Nov. 8

This fellowship is intended to provide outstanding PhD candidates with financial support to assist in the process of completing their doctoral dissertations. The fellowship consists of full

support for one academic semester (either Fall 2025 or Spring 2026) and includes a monthly stipend equal to that of the current 50% GPTI salary, tuition coverage of up to five dissertation hours, mandatory fees, and coverage under the student gold health insurance plan.

## **GEOL Electives and Field Classes**




#### GEOL 3450-5700: Petroleum and Transitional Reservoir Geology



#### GEOL 4120-5120: Advanced Structural Geology and Tectonics

This course will cover some advanced topics in structural geology and tectonics. It will provide exposure to theory and applications related to deformation (rheology) of solid Earth materials.
