
Congratulations, you made it! The last day of classes will be today, December 12th, followed by reading day on Friday the 13th. Final grades will be posted on December 24th.




GEOL 3450-5700: Petroleum and Transitional Reservoir Geology



GEOL 4120-5120: Advanced Structural Geology and Tectonics

This course will cover some advanced topics in structural geology and tectonics. It will provide exposure to theory and applications related to deformation (rheology) of solid Earth materials. He processes that will be covered span a wide range of depths depending on the materials, from the flow of ice and salt near Earth's surface to cataclastic mechanisms in fault rocks to plastic flow of deep crust and mantle rock.
