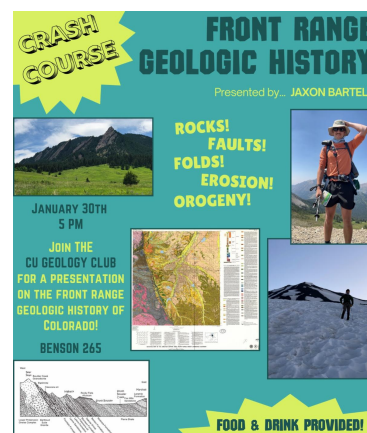
Grad Volunteers & Save the Date
