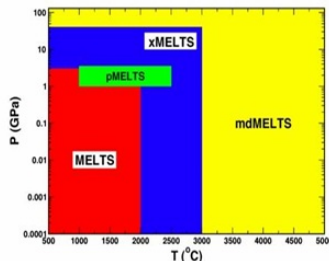

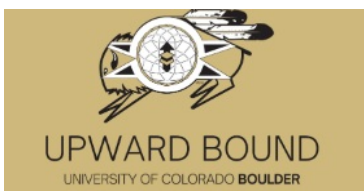
To apply please submit a 2-page proposal that includes: a short project description, a budget with justifications, a short CV for the undergraduate student, and a mentor statement.
