Colorado Water Fellows Program

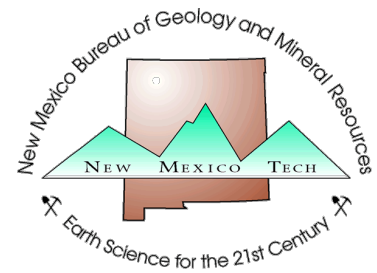
