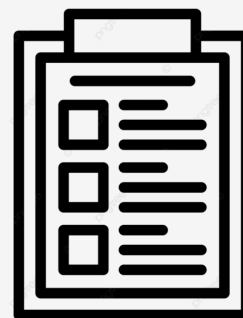

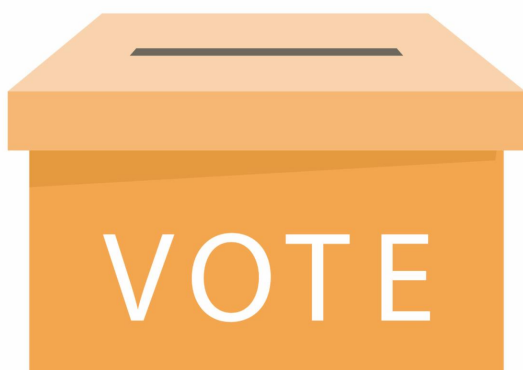

## Great Basin Institute

The National Parks Service is looking for two Geologic & GIS Technician interns to assist with creating a high-resolution geologic map of John Day Fossil Beds National Monument in eastern and central Oregon! The selected candidates will produce an updated, high-resolution geologic map of all three units of JODA in ArcGIS Pro, produce cross-sections with orientation data, create accessible versions of the maps for multiple audiences (print, web, etc.), conduct fieldwork, update related workflows, updated geologic descriptions for each unit in JODA, present at a professional conference and to JODA visitors, and publish the map in a peer-reviewed journal. The position is through partners at The Great Basin Institute which offers benefits including overtime, paid leave, and health insurance. It will be a nine-month, full time internship.
