Regular graduate faculty appointments may be given to full-time tenure/tenure track faculty members of CU Boulder who hold the rank of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professor, or Research Professor. **Special** graduate faculty appointments may be given to those individuals who do not meet the criteria outlined for regular membership, such as CU Boulder Instructors, Lecturers, Scholars in Residence, Research Associates, and retired Professors; and those outside of the university with evidence of continuing scholarship, teaching, and/or professional competence.

Credit hour requirements, Master's: 30 total credit hours, of which 4 to 6 must be Master's Thesis (GEOL 6950). Up to 6 credits may be at the 3000-4000 undergraduate level, and up to 9 graduate-level credits may be transferred with approval. For students who switch to the Plan II (non-thesis) track, the 6950 requirement is replaced by 3 credits of Plan II Master's Research (GEOL 6960).

Credit hour requirements, PhD: 60 total credit hours, of which 30 must be Doctoral Dissertation (GEOL 8990). Undergraduate credits may be taken, but they do not count toward the total. Up to 10 graduate-level credits may be transferred with approval, and up to 21 by petition.

Additional per-term minimum enrollment requirements apply to Fall and Spring semesters, but not to Summer unless the student defends during Summer. Course grades below *C* are not accepted for the Master's program, course grades below *B*- are not accepted for the PhD program, and courses taken pass/fail do not count toward graduate degree requirements. Students must maintain at least a B (3.00) grade point average overall.
