## **Fellowship Application** **Certificate in Engineering, Ethics & Society**

Herbst Fellows are scholars drawn from students enrolled in the Engineering, Ethics & Society Certificate Program and embody the program's commitment to ethical practice and engaged scholarship.

Herbst Fellows receive a \$500 scholarship. During their fellowship year, Herbst Fellows interrogate the ethical issues most important to them by producing a profile of their work to be published in the Spring 2022 *Colorado Engineering Magazine*.

### Application Process:

Applicants must be students in good standing in the College of Engineering and Applied Science and must be enrolled in the Engineering, Ethics & Society Certificate Program.

Applicants must provide a personal statement, 500-700 words, in response to the following prompt:

In your statement describe how you became interested in the wider social and ethical implications of engineering and science. What issue or issues are you most concerned about and why? How do you intend to further your interests in engineering, science and ethics? How do you see ethical questions affecting your future studies and professional choices?

Herbst Fellows will be chosen on the strengths of their personal statements. However, please feel free to write your personal statement in manner that most suits your experiences and your concerns.
