

- What obligations do we have to past generations?
- What obligations do we have to future generations?
- What do we owe poor people in distant countries today?
- What about non-human animals?

This discussion-oriented class offers an introduction to philosophical thinking about these and other questions via a critical survey of recent philosophical writings on a variety of contemporary social issues.

It does not presuppose any background in philosophy or familiarity with any of the issues to be discussed.
