
In Honors Program courses, students discuss, debate, and exchange ideas in ways not possible in large lecture classes. The Honors Program also awards Latin honors - cum laude, magna cum laude, or summa cum laude - to graduating seniors in the College of Arts and Sciences who have successfully written and defended honors theses. In addition, we sponsor and produce the Honors

Journal, a student-run publication which publishes works from all academic disciplines represented on the CU Boulder campus. Qualified students interested in taking part in an honors living-learning community have the option of applying to live in the Honors Residential Academic Program (Honors RAP).

Who is Eligible?

- Incoming first-year and transfer students are automatically considered for the Honors Program as part of their application to the College of Arts & Sciences. The top 10% are honors-qualified via multiple factors and receive an invitation to Honors in their student portal. Manual reviews are available by request; email honors@colorado.edu to be manually considered.
- ▶ Continuing students in the College of Arts & Sciences (after their first year at CU) must maintain a 3.3+ cumulative GPA to be eligible to participate.

What Does One Participate In?

- <u>All</u> of the Honors Program offerings are <u>optional</u>; Honors students are not required to participate in any specific component.
- ▶ Honors students can choose to participate in the aspects of the program that are interesting to them or are beneficial to their academic careers.
- ▶ Honors students can also apply to live and participate in the Honors Residential Academic Program (Honors RAP) in Smith Hall.

Why Participate in Honors?

- ▶ Enjoy a deeper learning experience through small, discussion-based classes.
- ▶ Connect with faculty and other Honors students through events such as our Distinguished Lecture Series, Mood Boosts, TV With a Prof, SciTalks, Skills Studio Workshops, Thesis Symposium, social mixers, and more.
- ▶ Gain leadership experience by joining our Student Advisory Board or Honors Journal team.
- ▶ Help build community through the Honors Scholars program. This is a significant achievement that students can add to their resume or CV.
- Write an honors thesis to be eligible to graduate with Latin honors (such as *summa cum laude*).
