

## FAQs



### How will I know which Honors RAP class I get?

We will do our best to register you for one of your course options.

The Honors RAP class is identified by the section number & an "R"; for example, EBIO 1210-**888R** or WRTG 1250-**890R**.

If all goes as planned, you will see your Honors RAP class on your fall 2017 schedule in your MyCUinfo before you complete the rest of your fall schedule.

### What if I need to change my Honors RAP class?

If you need to change your Honors RAP class, contact the Honors RAP as soon as possible.

### I'm an engineer or pre-engineer student. Can I take Math 1300?

Yes you can. While the College of Engineering prefers APPM 1350, MATH 1300 is accepted; confirmed by pre-engineering advisor and the College of Engineering.

### Why aren't there classes for my major?

Because the Honors RAP is not a department/major themed RAP, we cannot focus course offerings around a particular degree program.

We aim to help you stay on track for your degree by offering courses that fulfill other requirements, core curriculum & elective requirements.

All degrees have core curriculum and elective requirements.

\* Notice - there are a few classes that may contribute towards ones major requirements, for example Math 1300 or EBIO 1210.

### Do I have to take a class?

All first-year students in the Honors RAP are required to take one Honors RAP course each semester, both fall 2017 and spring 2018 semesters.
