## Tips for choosing your Honors RAP class

When considering options for your Honors RAP course, here are some things to think about.

## 1. Your interests

Your first year is a good time to take courses that interest you. Although such courses might not be in your major course of studies, they may count as core or elective credit. As you progress in your academic career, you may find that there is less time and/or opportunity to take a class outside of your major(s).

## 2. Your core curriculum requirements.

Your degree plan requires classes in core curriculum categories. Carefully read the <u>Honors RAP Schedule of Courses</u>, paying particular attention to the **Core column**.
