### I Love Rock n' Roll: The Story of a Smith Hall Musician

In the days leading up to opening for a sold-out show at Red Rocks Amphitheater (Morrison, CO), Jason Cummings could hardly eat. Now a Smith Hall resident and freshman, Cummings eats at the C4C just fine, and although he practices metal guitar slightly less, Cummings has not given up his music.

"It's the most central part of who I am and has been ever since I started playing," said Cummings. "It really helped me through some tougher times in my life."

Cummings has played guitar for six years. His experiences include playing with the School of Rock, an international program of music schools focused on rock music, on the 106.7 KBPI radio station; playing with Mark Schulman, the touring drummer for P!nk; and performing at Red Rocks Amphitheater.

"Overall, the School of Rock was the best thing that could have happened to me in terms of music," said Cummings. "There were a bunch of cool people there, and I had some of the coolest experiences."

Cummings brought two guitars with him to college. All together he has six guitars, a bass, and a drum kit. In the future, Cummings will develop his skills as a multi-instrumentalist and possibly write and record his own material.
