

# The Humanities Major Requirements

A total of 42 credit hours is required for the major.

**I. Intro to Humanities & Writing in Humanities—choose two of the following (6 hours):**

- HUMN 1001 Forms of Narrative: An Introduction to Humanities
- HUMN 1002 Visualizing Culture: An Introduction to Humanities
- HUMN 1003 Conflicts in History: Civilization & Culture: An Introduction to Humanities
- HUMN 1004 Sound and Meaning: An Introduction to Humanities
- HUMN 2092 Creating Meaning: Writing in Humanities

**II. HUMN 2000: Methods/Approaches to Humanities (3 hours)**

**III. Public, Practical, or Creative Humanities course—choose one of the following or consult with the Director of Undergraduate Studies for more options (3 hours):**

- HUMN 3092 Studies in Humanities: The Podcast
- HUMN 3093 Topics in Humanities: Applied History
- HUMN 3930 Humanities Internship

**IV. Upper-division HUMN courses (18 hours):**

Six courses selected from the upper-division offerings taught by Humanities Program faculty (prefix HUMN). These include courses on different themes, periods, geographical areas, cultural groups, theories, media, and more.

**V. Outside area of study (12 hours):** To be fulfilled by choosing one of the following courses of study.

- A major, minor, or certificate in another discipline (12 hours required)
- 12 hours chosen according to a common theme or cluster (to be determined in consultation with and approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies)

## Examples of Choices for the Outside Course of Study

With the guidance of advising and the HUMN program, you can craft your outside areas of study in a way that is intellectually and personally meaningful to you. For example, you can choose...

- **A major, minor, or certificate in another discipline**, such as Music, Philosophy, Psychology, Anthropology, Ethnic Studies, Communication, Dance, INVST, EBIO, Mathematics, Cinema Studies, Theatre, Creative Writing, etc. (A total of 12 credit hours in the area is required.)
- **12 credit hours chosen according to a common theme** that allows you to explore new combinations of knowledge and contemporary issues. Either construct your own theme or pursue one of our clusters: Ecocriticism, Medical Humanities, Game Studies, Media Studies, Popular Music Studies, Law in Literature and Art, Digital Humanities, or Narrative.

Students should consult with the HUMN Director of Undergraduate Studies before making choices regarding your outside area of study.
