IAFS Year in Review

In 2025, the International Affairs Program continued to grow and strengthen its community. With more than **400 majors** and over **100 minors**, IAFS remains one of the largest interdisciplinary programs on campus. This past year calendar, we celebrated **106 graduates** and awarded 24 **Global Grants** totaling more than **\$46,000** to help students deepen their global education both inside and outside the classroom. Student engagement continued to rise with the relaunch of the **IAFS Club**, 14 new mentor–mentee pairs in the **IAFS Mentorship Program**, and over 20 events ranging from academic panels to campuswide fairs.

We also welcomed two new Teaching Assistant Professors—Molly Todd (IAFS/Sociology) and Jeffrey Nonnemacher (IAFS/Honors)—who bring fresh expertise to our curriculum and community. Overall, 2025 was a year of momentum, connection, and continued global learning.


ICYMI - U.S. Recovery Efforts in Jamaica After Hurricane Melissa
