• Anti-Oppression Community Conversation: Ideological Diversity in the INVST Classroom National Association of Scholars (NAS) report

- INVST was scrutinized & criticized in a recent report written by conservative political advocacy organization NAS. We have already talked with CU Engage staff, INVST founders, FAB, and we wanted to share here about what has happened and how INVST has addressed it
- In the report, they critiqued the type of work we do, and utilized information from our website and framed our work with a negative, conservatively biased viewpoint, calling us "The New Civics" in a negative way & suggesting that we waste taxpayer money in the process of "indoctrinating" young people
- Peter Wood was involved in the creation of this report. He had ear of then President-elect Donald Trump at the end of 2016 to present a lengthy plan on how a Trump Administration ought to change higher ed across the country, making it more patriotic & less liberal.
- NAS hadn't asked to interview INVST or CU Engage at all: no first-hand research was conducted through interviews for this report; all info was gathered from our web sites & then framed by the NAS authors, w/o our consultation
- After the NAS report was published, INVST and CU Engage staff were invited to an event "Wasted Colleges" that was on Jan 13th. Because the presentation by Peter Wood would not have space for open conversation, we decided to boycott.
- We notified some of our community partners who were listed [SPAN, Natural Capitalism Solutions, Philanthropiece Fdn, New Era Colorado & Intercambio] in the report just incase there was media attending; there hasn't, so far, been much media attention

- CU Engage has been working with Strategic Communications (SC). SC has met with the provost & chancellor. Provost in particular is extremely supportive of INVST & CU Engage & will "defend our honor to the Regents if necessary".
- INVST staff are so grateful for CU Engage, overall as a community we feel like we acted quickly and strategically, with integrity & allegiance to & pride in our mission & our approach, & it was SO nice to not be isolated while addressing this situation.
- Overall our organizational response was effective, however, there might be more attention like this because of current political scene so we are being proactive, looking at our messaging and our relationship w/ the community. A FAB sub-committee has met to discuss strategic communications & preparedness for INVST moving forward. They stand ready to advise.
- o Next we had a discussion about ideological diversity
 - Open dialogue on the idea of liberal/ multicultural studies as exploiting free labor from students (a k a "volunteering") and teaching them how to resist & oppose the government.
