Sabs sent out an email asking people to approve a proposal of cross listing INVS 4402-NV Social Movements with Ethnic Studies People of Color and Social Movements and Awon would teach this course. This was sent out via email b/c it was time sensitive. We have gone through with this process. If you are an ethnic studies student and are graduating in May, this may work in your favor retroactively.

Annie increase in summer (spf) staff salary bc

- 1) Its been 5 years since we had a salary staff increase
- 2) First time we open up the applicant pool beyond INVST alum

Wanted to compare what we're paying with the current industry baseline

Now- we pay a lump sum of \$2500 for 27 days of work

Proposal- Move to a daily rate on a scale that would compensate for experience and expertise for 30 days

*Pay scale- an additional \$10/day added to spfs on economic justice summer who are fluent in Spanish

\$90/day for \$2700- 1st year working for INVST, no prior exp

\$100/day for \$3000- 1-2 years experience

\$110/day for \$3300-more than 2 years in the field

Q's- would it affect the \$1500 summer fee- No

Would it otherwise cause stress on other parts of INVST budget- not really
