

FALL 2024 CHECKLIST for New Exchange Students

Now that you have been accepted to the University of Colorado at Boulder as an exchange student, there are several steps you need to take as soon as you receive the DS-2019. International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) has prepared this checklist to assist you.

Make Sure Your Passport is Valid

Your passport must be valid for at least six months after the date you enter the United States.

Pay Your SEVIS Fee

J-1 visa holders beginning a new program at CU-Boulder must pay a SEVIS fee to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) **before** a visa can be issued. Apply for Your Visa

Apply at the nearest US embassy or consulate when you receive your DS-2019 since the visa may take some time to obtain. You must make an appointment to go to the embassy or consulate. You must take your SEVIS fee receipt with you to your appointment.

Read Pre-Arrival Information

- Register for your courses: [CU Boulder Registration](#) on or after **April 29, 2024**.
- Prepare your finances. See your financial requirements in your application.
- Prepare your [insurance compliance form](#) **You will be required to upload a similar form AFTER you arrive in the US**
- Prepare and bring your complete immunization records.
- Make your travel arrangements: If you are arriving in Boulder before your move-in date for your accommodation is available, and you need a place to stay, see a list of hotels here: [Boulder Colorado Accommodations](#)
- Choose the clothing you need for your first few months in Boulder. Read about Boulder's variable climate: [Boulder Colorado Weather](#)

Travel Tips: You may arrive in the United States **up to 30 days** before your report date on your DS-2019. You may remain in the U.S. for 30 days **after** the end date on your DS-2019 if you choose. If you want to stay longer, then please consult with ISSS about your options to change your status.

Plan your travel to arrive in Boulder by **Sunday, August 18, 2024**. Exchange students will be required to attend new student orientation sessions that will take place on **Monday, August 19, 2024**.

First day of class: Tuesday, **August 26, 2024**.

Expect the process at the [U.S. Port of Entry](#) to take time. Allow at least two hours to clear the port of entry and to transfer to your next flight.

Bring with you on board the airplane the following documents so you can present them if needed at U.S. Customs and Port of Entry upon arrival:

- Your passport
- SEVIS form DS-2019 (immigration document used to apply for your J1 visa)
- Evidence of your financial resources
- Evidence of your student or exchange visitor status, such as your acceptance letter
- Paper receipt for the payment of the SEVIS fee
- International Student & Scholar Services contact information
- Completed J-1 insurance compliance form and information on your policy (if you are a J-student).
- ISSS also recommends you carry a copy of your Fall 2024 class schedule.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING: On-campus housing is extremely limited. You must apply early. <https://www.colorado.edu/living/housing/explore-apartment-style-and-residence-hall-living/bear-creek>

Our campus has a culture of off-campus living for most students who have not recently graduated from high school. We share this with you because we have a very robust off-campus community that surrounds our entire 2-mile campus and an office dedicated to supporting CU students as they seek off-campus housing. Upon Arrival in Boulder. You Must Attend These Required Meetings:

1. **NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION:** You must arrive in Boulder **no later than August 18, 2024.**
2. **Immigration Reporting Session:** Monday, August 19, 2024. Time and place to be announced.

The arrival date for exchange students is: Sunday, January 18, 2024	All J-1 students <u>may</u> arrive up to 30 days before the start date on your DS-2019. January 18, 2024
<u>NEW STUDENT WELCOME.</u> Exchange students are expected to attend orientation sessions the week prior to the start of class. The schedule is still in progress. ISSS will notify you with the schedule.	DO NOT BOOK your flights until you have received your DS-2019 and the orientation schedule.
First day of classes	August 19, 2024 (Mon)
Last Day to Drop a Class	September 4, 2024
Fall Break (no classes)	November 25 – 29, 2024 (Mon-Fri)
Last Day of Classes	December 12, 2024 (Thurs)
Final Exams	December 14 - 18, 2024 (Sat-Wed)
