

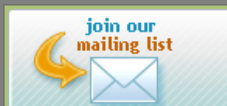

During his time here at CU, Tristan completed a capstone project that analyzed victim's rights in Israel and the United States. His primary focus was the comparison of how each country deals with important questions like when a person is a victim of a crime and what their rights are.

Tristan's capstone project has directly impacted his present and future endeavors. Tristan is currently not only an intern at the Boulder County District Attorney's Office but also an intern at a defense attorney's office in Parker, Colorado, and a mentor at Boulder County Community Justice Center for a troubled youth. Tristan is applying for law school which he hopes to begin Fall 2014.

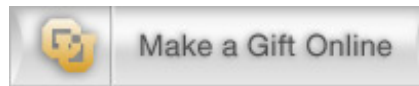

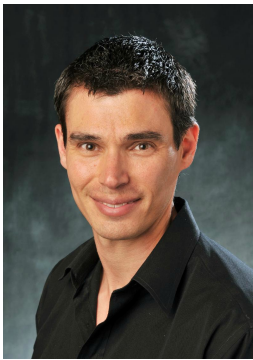

[David Shneer](#), Director of the Program in Jewish Studies, Louis P. Singer Endowed Chair in Jewish History, and Professor of History was recently awarded the [2013 Jordan Schnitzer Book Award](#) from the [Association for Jewish Studies](#) for his book [Through Soviet Jewish Eyes: Photography, War and the Holocaust](#). The judges, who selected Professor Shneer's book for the category of Jews and the Arts, called his work "a ground-breaking study" that is "meticulously researched" and "opens new directions in social and cultural history and the history of the Holocaust, and demonstrates the importance of photography and the arts in our understanding of Jewish history." Professor Shneer will be honored at a special reception at the upcoming AJS conference in Boston. Almog Behar is an award winning writer and poet, writing and publishing in both Hebrew and Arabic. Behar is actively engaged in a vibrant community of Jewish and Palestinian Israeli writers - who write in both Hebrew and Arabic - and has participated in the organization of bilingual poetry readings and publications. His own fiction and poetry explore the connections between Hebrew and Arabic, insist on the importance of Arabic culture in contemporary Israel and highlight the historic and tradition-based connections between Judaism and Islam and Jewish and Muslim communities throughout the Middle East. Behar will be in conversation with [Dr. Liora Halperin](#), Assistant Professor in History and Jewish Studies for an evening that will include readings and discussions of some of Behar's most recent work.

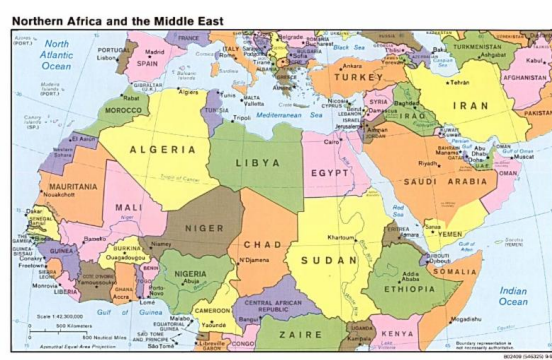
