



<u>Brian Catlos</u>, Professor of Religious Studies, will be conducting a guest lecture entitled "A New Take on the Crusades," October 2 for <u>Prof. Younus Mirza's</u> course *Islam and Other Faiths* at Alleghany College. He will be also be conducting a CU Chancellor's Seminar October 3 entitled, "Islamic Culture, Medieval Spain, the Mediterranean and the West: From Bob Dylan to Deep Blue."

Elias Sacks, Assistant Professor in Religious Studies and Director of Graduate Studies for the Program in Jewish Studies, will be speaking at two conferences in the coming weeks. On September 30, he will deliver a paper entitled "Religion Contested: Mendelssohn's Aesthetic Critique of Christianity" at a conference on Sara Levy's World: Music, Gender, and Judaism in Enlightenment Berlin at Rutgers. On October 1, he will speak at CU as part of a conference, organized by the Musuem of Natural History, on The Meaning of Names: Naming Diversity in the 21st Century. His paper will be entitled "The Perils and Promise of Philosophical Naming: Moses Mendelssohn on Philosophy, History, and Language."

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of students and volunteers, nearly one-third of the materials received last winter from the Mazal Holocaust Collection have been inventoried. Special thanks to Jewish Studies affiliated graduate students Sarah Gavison and Scott Meyers, undergraduate student Eric Alterman, volunteer student from Brandeis University Eli Boonin-Vail, and Jewish Studies alum Ren Scherling for making great progress on making this collection accessible for everyone.



At the end of last semester, the archive received a gift from Richard Campbell that includes archival materials from the ReichsKulturKammer (RKK or The Nazi Imperial Chamber of Culture). These rare documents provide documentation on cultural norms, propaganda, and the de-Judiazation of Germany and German-occupied territories during World War II. In addition, the Campbell Collection includes books, articles and documents on the history, leadership and mission of the RKK, files on Jewish individuals and organizations banned after 1933, materials on economic laws passed to exclude Jews from doing business in Germany, lists of Jews living in Germany and Austria compiled by the Gestapo in 1938, the 1942 publication that outlined the post-war European economic plan and strategy (i.e. European Common Market) and numerous other rare documents. Thanks to Jewish Studies affiliated graduate student Rivka Weisberg for completing an inventory of the documents from this collection.

Finally, with the passing of Rabbi Zalman Schachter-Shalomi on July 3, 2014, there is a new urgency to add more photos, audio and videos to our digital library site. We hope to begin scanning important papers and documents soon.

Throughout the year, Menorah is hosting a lecture series highlighting the faculty of the Program in Jewish Studies.


