Letter From Our Director, David Shneer

Dear CU Jewish Studies community and friends,

In the summer of 2008 I came to CU-Boulder as a senior historian charged with the task of creating a Program in Jewish Studies. Over the past seven years, with your help, we have built a world class program that now includes a major, two minors, a graduate program,



global seminars, and more than 1500 students taking our courses each year. The program has a solid foundation through generous gifts of an endowed chair, lectureship, fellowships and scholarships. Ongoing donor support together with an investment from the College will continue to grow our program. The bottom line is that the program has been so successful because of the passion and support of CU's students, faculty, staff, administration, and the community. Thank you for your investment and involvement.

I am writing to let you know that as of June 30, 2015, I will be stepping down as director of Jewish Studies. I do so now because I feel I have accomplished what I was charged to do and with gratitude for the many people, like you, who have helped us achieve so many firsts for CU.

Don't worry. I'm not going very far. After taking a sabbatical, I will be returning to Jewish Studies in many different capacities, will continue my work teaching and researching in the Department of History, and am excited to announce that I will be taking the helm as Chair of the Department of Religious Studies which has its own incredible faculty, staff and

Jewish Studies and Religious Studies have collaborated on many projects since 2008 including hiring two new tenure-line professors who are in both units, establishing the Post-Holocaust American Judaism Archive and Embodied Judaism series, and bringing to the university global seminars to Jerusalem and Istanbul. Therefore, in my new role as chair of Religious Studies, I look forward to working with many of you long into the future.

You will be in very good hands with the incoming director of the Program in Jewish Studies, Dr. Nan Goodman, a professor in the English department, who is incredibly excited to meet and work with each one of you. To date, Dr. Goodman's work has focused on American literature of the nineteenth century and the colonial era. Her book in progress, *The Puritan Cosmopolis*, demonstrates her growing interest in Jewish Studies as she shows how the Puritans were inspired by their Biblical predecessors to envision a new kind of global political community. Goodman's future work will be taking her to Turkey, where she will lead the new global seminar to Istanbul and where she serves as the founding proponent of what she and others hope will be a new institute at Boğaziçi University



dedicated to Jewish Studies, the first of its kind in Turkey and likely in any country with a Muslim majority.




