
Gavin Coulson is a senior majoring in Jewish Studies and Japanese Language and Culture. This Spring, he is studying abroad in Israel.

Research in Jewish Studies: How, What, Why?



1492: Columbus, the Jews, and the Messiah in Spain Public Lecture with Professor Matt Goldish 2017 Sondra and Howard Bender Visiting Scholar

The Program in Jewish Studies at the University of Colorado Boulder is pleased to welcome our 2017 annual Sondra and Howard Bender Visiting Scholar, Professor Matt Goldish, Professor of History and Jewish Studies at Ohio State University and the Melton Chair in Jewish History.

In his public lecture, *1492: Columbus, the Jews, and the Messiah in Spain*, Professor Goldish will focus on three enormous events that occurred in Spain during 1492: the end of the centuries-long war to end Muslim rule in the Iberian peninsula; the voyage of Christopher Columbus;



and the expulsion of the Jews. These events are intimately connected, and their intersection runs directly through Spanish expectations about the messiah. Is it possible that we did not learn everything there is to know about Columbus in school? Find out from a Columbus resident.
