

14-Credit Cap VS Experiential Learning

14 Credit Cap

Not all JD students take coursework within the 14-credit cap. It is possible to graduate without any journal, competition, Barristers' Council, non-law, ILR, or externship credit. Fine if you do, there is just a limit on how many credits are allowed.

Clinics do not count towards the 14-credit cap.

Journals, competitions, Barristers' Council, non-law credits, externships, study abroad, and ILR credit count towards the 14-credit cap. You are limited to a total of 14 credits and there are also sub-caps.

Externships are part of the 14-credit cap. You can take up to seven total credits. Or, do one, 10-credit externship with permission.

YOU CAN TAKE THESE COURSE TYPES IF YOU WANT, BUT NO MORE THAN 14 AND WATCH FOR THE SUB-CAPS. (The 14-credit cap is not needed for graduation).

Experiential Learning Grad Req.

All JD students must complete at least six credits of experiential learning coursework for graduation.

Clinics count as exp. learning coursework.

Journals, competitions, Barristers' Council, non-law credits, study abroad, and ILR credit do not count towards the exp. learning graduation requirement.

Students can count up to four externship credits towards the exp. learning grad. requirement.
