1. Completed application. Please send your completed application, along with a check or money order for \$65, made out to the *University of Colorado*, for our non-refundable application fee, to the following address:

2. Required personal essay. Please submit an essay, in your own words, on the topic above. Your essay should be no longer than 500 words, typed, and double-spaced.

3. Your resume or CV. Please show volunteer activities as well as paid work experience.

4. Two letters of recommendation. At least one of the letters should be from a law school professor. A copy of the Letter of Recommendation Cover Sheet form must accompany the letters. This form is available on our website (<http://www.colorado.edu/law/admissions/apply-colorado-law/apply-transfer-or-visiting-student>).

5. Official transcripts. Submit transcripts for all previous college, university, and law school work. Please also submit a letter of good standing from the dean of your current law school. If you are applying to visit, please also include a letter granting permission from your home school for you to visit at Colorado Law. Transfer applicants must include their class rank information.

6. CAS report. Submit a copy of the first page of your CAS report. Your law school should be able to provide you with a copy from your student file.

7. If you believe you qualify for in-state tuition status in Colorado, also complete the **Request for In-state Tuition Classification** form, which is available on our website at <https://www.colorado.edu/law/residencyform>.
