

## The Impact of Scholarships

199 students awarded donor funded scholarships in 2023-24 (a 5% increase from 2022-23)
100% All 2Ls and 3Ls who applied received some form of private scholarship funding
77 Summer fellowships were privately funded
190 Total JD students enrolled
11% Increase in privately funded scholarship dollars
33 Graduates working in qualifying public service positions benefitted from the Loan Repayment Assistance Program (LRAP)

## **Career Profile**

Every year, employers across the state and nation are impressed with our graduating class, and the past few years have been especially inspiring. On April 3, 2024 Colorado Law reported post-graduation employment data for its class of 2023 to the American Bar Association (ABA). Below is a summary of the employment information for the class of 2023 as of ten months after graduation, March 15, 2024.



2023 graduates reported employment ten months after graduation (March 15, 2024)



90% (154/171) of graduates reported a full-time, long-term (does not have a definite term of less than one year) job for which bar passage was required or a JD degree was an advantage.



84% (144/171) of graduates reported a full-time, long-term job for which bar passage was required.

By Sector: 48% law firms, 15% Public interest, 14% government, 14% Judicial Clerkships,

8% business, 1% education 80% of those reporting employment are in CO.



### Class of 2023 offer timing:

- 75% have an offer before graduation
- 15% after graduation but before bar results
- 10% offer after bar results

The scholarship I was awarded helped fuel the beginning of my career. The scholarship relieved some of the stress of paying for law school, which allows me to focus on performing well as a Fellow at the Colorado Attorney General's Office. The fields in which I want to work are not the most lucrative, so scholarships like the one I received are incredibly valued.
